This term our Christian Value is Peace. Jesus said: "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God." (Matthew 5:9) Peace-making actions can range from helping to resolve conflict to creating space for stillness. Christians believe that peace is God's intention for the whole of creation, and is a promise that awaits ultimate fulfilment.
