I would also like to take this opportunity to thank you, and your children, for your kind and thoughtful support at the start of this new school year.


Attendance and Behaviour Matters!

A huge thank you for your magnificent effort with attendance at the start of this school year. Our attendance figure for our first week was an awesome 97%! All school staff will continue to work with pupils and their families to support our children to attend school regularly and punctually to ensure they gain the greatest benefit from their education. Golden Time is an opportunity to reward the children for making positive behaviour choices meaning that they have the chance to participate in special activities for 30 minutes on a Friday afternoon.
