NSPCC SPEAK OUT STAY SAFE ONLINE PROGRAMME Y1 - 6

I am pleased to tell you that this term we will be participating in the NSPCC Speak out Stay safe online programme during the week commencing 26th September. Children will be taking part in an online assembly and a variety of classroom based activities. Speak out Stay safe is a safeguarding programme available to all primary schools in the UK and Channel Islands. It aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse in a child friendly, interactive way. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a trusted adult or Childline.

In the online assembly, the Speak out Stay safe messages are delivered in a fun and interactive way with the help of their mascot Buddy as well as special guest appearances from Ant and Dec. We have studied the content of the materials and are extremely confident that they are appropriate for primary school aged children. By the end of the programme, we believe that children will feel empowered – knowing how they can speak out and stay safe.
