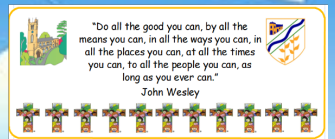

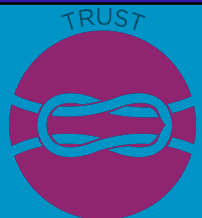
## OUR VISION ALL

It is an incredibly important role but anyone (absolutely anyone) can motivate themselves to be an Agent of Change. We all have the power to do something, to change just one thing that can have a positive effect on the people or world around us!

In term 1 our Christian Value was Creation and our focus Bible story was the story of Creation (Genesis 1: 1-31) and we revisited Reverence and Respect with the story of Jesus in the Temple (Matthew 21: 12-16). This term our Christian Value is FRIENDSHIP and FELLOWSHIP, our focus story is The story of Jesus and his best friend John (Stories throughout the New Testament) and we have been revisiting PEACE with the story of The Stilling of the Storm (Matthew 8: 23-27).

In our classes, reflecting on worships, we discussed what friendship means to us:

Emilia: "Love your friend like you love your neighbour. Love is important within friendship."

Ariana: "Friendship is love that holds your heart."

Rio: "A bond built on trust, forgiveness and experiences you face together."



Next term we will be exploring the Christian Value of Perseverance and revisiting the value of Courage.
