COLLECTIVE WORSHIP COULCIL

In Terms 3 and 4, the Collective Worship Council (CWC) have been busy Agents of Change within the local community.

The CWC have been taking their Collective Worship to The Cedars Care Home in Bourne. For each visit, the councillors carefully and thoughtfully prepared each worship based on the Christian Value focus. To date, they have looked at the Christian Values of 'Perseverance' and 'Courage'.

For 'Courage', the children chose the Bible story of 'Daniel and the Lion' to read and act out as a well as sharing the key message behind the story with the residents. For 'Perseverance' we looked at the story of 'The Lost Sheep'. The council members also recited our memory verse of the term whilst also asking the residents to reflect on each theme too. The councillors aspired to make each worship inclusive to all through acting and presenting their ideas clearly. Following each worship the councillors led a craft activity with the residents. Both the residents and councillors have gained so much from these experiences by sharing ideas, stories and skills to complete craft tasks such as weaving to make a 'God's eye'. The councillors explained that the sticks represented the cross that Jesus was crucified on and the pattern and the 'eye' in the centre represents the power of seeing and understanding things we cannot normally see.

OUR CHRISTIAN VALUES

This term our Christian Value is Forgiveness and our focus story is The story of Zacchaeus Luke 19: 1-10 and we have been revisiting Compassion.
