Our blazing topic this term is all about the Great Fire of London...

In English we will be searching for information, asking questions, comparing London then and now, writing our own adventure story and writing a recount to describe our incredible Partake Theatre workshop experience!



In Maths we will be starting the term with our money unit. We will identify coins and notes, count in pounds and pence and find different ways to make the same amount. Throughout our multiplication and division unit, we will be counting in 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's to become fluent with our times tables. In Science we are emblazing our scientific skills by exploring materials and their uses. We will learn all about a hero called Traction Man and the different adventures he goes on. We will then use our knowledge about the properties of materials to design a new suit for him! We will also be thinking about how we can stay safe online and celebrating Safer Internet Day in February.



We will be sequencing the events of the Great Fire in History, as well as comparing London now and in the past. We will be exploring the monarchy and looking closely at the accuracy of sources of evidence we have for the Great Fire. We will be using many different resources online to help light up our cross-curricular learning and transport the children back in time to 1666!

This term our Christian values are Courage and we will then revisit Perseverance. Along with exploring stories of courage in the Bible, we will also be finding out who was courageous during the Great Fire. Our Character Education trait is 'integrity'. In RE we will be learning about Thankfulness and exploring the different ways that people say thank you around the world. We will learn and compare Harvest festivals.
