Epic English

This term in English we will be exploring the adventures of different heroes, starting with the Anglo-Saxon myth, Beowulf. Throughout this epic poem, we will learn of Beowulf's remarkable bravery as he faces a variety of fearsome beasts, before we create our own hideous creatures for him to battle. During our learning, we will look closely at sentence structure and how this can be used to vary the impact our writing has on the reader. During our reading time, we will share the hilarious adventures of Hiccup in How to Train Your Dragon by Cressida Cowell. We will meet an array of dragons and become dragonologists in search of a new species to write about in our non-chronological reports.

Dragons will also be the subject of our poetry unit of work as we explore Anglo-Saxon Kenning poems.



'Listen Up' it's Science!

Our topic on sound will lead us to investigate vibrations, pitch and volume and we will be working scientifically, testing materials to find the best insulators for soundproofing. Later in the term, we will be learning about electricity. We will revisit some of the uses of electricity before exploring electrical safety both inside and outside of the home. We will learn how to construct circuits as well as change the components.



In music we are using the sea as our inspiration. We will be exploring three-part songs, 3/4 timing, composing rhythmic accompaniment and developing our performance skills.

In art we are studying Anglo-Saxon art by focusing on the Sutton Hoo burial findings, illuminated letters painted in the Lindisfarne Gospels and the Bayeux Tapestry.

Terms 5 and 6 Jigsaw pieces are 'Relationships' and 'Changing Me', which deal with building positive and healthy relationships and coping positively with change—including how our bodies change.

R.E.



In R.E., we are focusing on Pilgrimage. After defining what a pilgrimage is, we will identify why people make journeys to special places, for religious and non-religious reasons. We will then explore the significance of certain places of pilgrimage, in particular Jerusalem, for different world faiths.

PF

This term, PE will be on a Monday and on a Tuesday, where we will be taking part in athletic, rounders, tennis and cricket skills. Please help your child to have their full PE kit in school every week.

Marvellous Maths

In maths this term, we will develop our knowledge and understanding of decimals and link to last term's learning about fractions. After that, we will move onto telling the time, properties of 2D and 3D shape and problem solving with money. We will also provide a variety of maths challenges that allow the children opportunities to consolidate their previous learning and skills.

History Heroes

Our theme of 'heroes' continues into our History topic, as we discover the bravery of the Anglo-Saxons and their battles with the Vikings. We will learn about significant individuals and events during Anglo-Saxon England, through the use of primary and secondary sources and follow a line of enquiry to answer the question: Did the settlement by the Anglo-Saxons make England a better or worse place to live?

A new palette of choice is revealed! This is a great opportunity for us to explore areas of our topic that we are particularly interested in and of course 'show-off' our amazing and imaginative presentation skills. Year 4-pupils are very independent but still need a little support with gathering resources and organising their time, so please help with this.
