

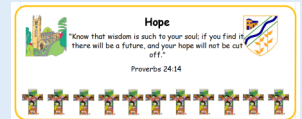
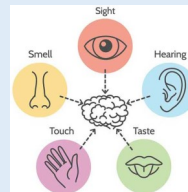


Year 3—Term 5/6

Firstly, we will work towards creating their very own non-chronological reports about two astounding explorers: Lakpa Rita Sherpa and Rick Hansen. The children will begin by using their inference skills to find facts about these inspiring real-life heroes. They will develop their reading fluency skills by echo and choral reading extracts from Alastair Humphrey's astonishing 'Great Adventurers' book. With confidence, children will be able to use adverbial phrases, fronted adverbials with commas and co-ordinating conjunctions in their non-chronological reports. The children will share their reports with Bourne Elsea Park Primary Academy children to receive constructive feedback to reflect on when writing their second report. In Term 6, we will be focusing on narrative writing. The children will explore the book 'How does chocolate taste on Everest?' to learn the importance of using their 5 senses to write descriptively.
