Please find below a new selection of 12 extra homework activities for you to complete whilst you are not at school. This gives you the flexibility to choose homework that appeals to you. We ask that you complete at least six activities. These are in addition to the reading, English and maths tasks in your pack.

### Music

Can you make up a song about springtime? You could use a tune you already know, e.g. twinkle, twinkle. Include some ideas of things you might see in spring, e.g. fluffy lambs, fuzzy buds.

Write out your song and decorate it with springtime pictures.



#### Science

In your exercise book, draw a plant with a flower. Maybe use a real one to copy. Label with the following parts: roots, leaf, petals, stem.

Now draw a tree. Label with the following parts: trunk, branches, roots, leaves, crown.

### RE

Talk to someone at home about a time when you've been into a church and write a recount of your visit. Try to include:

Why did you go to church? Was it for a wedding, christening, with school?

Who did you go with?
What did you do there?

Can you draw a picture of the church you visited to go with your recount?

### PE

Can you create some races for your garden or home to have a family sports afternoon?
It could be running, skipping, hopping, ball balancing, obstacle or your own ideas.
You could make medals or badges for prizes.
Remember to train!

### Science

Draw a countryside scene with fields, hedges, woods etc. Add appropriate animals that you might find eg fox, owl, field mouse. Label them and say whether they are herbivores, carnivores or omnivores.



# History

Choose an explorer that we have learnt about. Write in your exercise book at least 3 reasons

why they were braver than the other three. Remember to write in full sentences.



## Science

Create a chart of weather in your exercise book. Include sunny, rainy, cloudy, windy, foggy, frosty. Each day mark a tally for the weather we have had. Continue for 14 days. Which weather have we had most of?

Using clean recycling, can you build a model animal? It can be based on a real animal or you could create your own. Create a name for your new animal. What does it eat? Is it nocturnal? What body parts does it have?
